The life of each church is centred around its worship. So do feel free to come and meet us at any of our churches whether you have had a long association with the Christian faith or not.





FROM THE CLERGY

EU: In, Out, Shake it all about

e voted to leave the European Union by a tiny majority and are now living in the upheaval of that decision. It feels to many that so much feels broken at the moment with communities split, neighbours and households split: even our Tory government is fractured with friendships and alliances consigned to the bin. How we will be able to return to normal government and public life is hard to see.

"Do not put your trust in princes, in human beings, who cannot save", writes the Psalmist in Psalm 146. We all know that what is said on the hustings is quickly forgotten in government. When someone promises salvation it's best not to hold your breath.

Christians have been keen as anyone to put their trust in princes over the centuries. While we might rush to embrace candidates who are "saying what we are thinking" the outcome, as we have seen, is not always a good one. What we need is a lens, more than ever, through which we can see politics and power clearly.

It's not that hard to make such a lens. The apostle Paul gives us two really good starting points: where our heart's desires lay and how we should be as people. After all, what we desire and how we believe we should be, set the tone for what we want to see government and society do.

The first starting point is about where our mind should be. Paul writes in Phillippians 4:

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

We should be scouring all politics to find those who support people having



fulfilling and thriving lives regardless of their status. In God's Kingdom everyone will have a stake. On earth as it is heaven, we're told.

The second we find in Galatians 5

where Paul writes about the fruit those Kingdom people produce:
But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

If a politician's words or a campaign's slogans don't stand up to that list of fruits then neither will their governance.

Voting as a follower of Jesus frees us from the demands of party and tribal politics. Our identity comes from Christ first and then we may align ourselves with those we fit with. We start as independents who do not find their identity in 'isms' or economics. We are distrustful of slogans like "Take back control" or "Fixing a Broken Britain" because they raise far more questions than they answer.

In light of that, a great nation is one which removes vulnerability from people rather than increasing it; a great nation sees everyone as important to the well-being of the nation and therefore doesn't tolerate margins. It recognises people's limitations but doesn't establish their value based on those limitations.

The Kingdom of God is not going to come through the ballot box. The work of the Kingdom will not be replaced by reasonable policies and legislation. Instead, it comes from transformed people who live by the patterns God put in us at creation and who follow the one who lived it best and makes it possible for us to do it too.

Archbishops' Response to EU Referendum



Following the UK's vote to leave the European Union, I've made this joint statement with the Archbishop of York John Sentamu:

"On Thursday, millions of people from across the United Kingdom voted in the referendum, and a majority expressed a desire that Britain's future is to be outside the European Union

The outcome of this referendum has been determined by the people of this country. It is now the responsibility of the Government, with the support of Parliament, to take full account of the outcome of the referendum, and, in the light of this, decide upon the next steps. This morning, the Prime Minister David Cameron has offered a framework for when this process might formally begin.

The vote to withdraw from the European Union means that now we must all reimagine both what it means to be the United Kingdom in an interdependent world and what values and virtues should shape and guide our relationships with others.

As citizens of the United Kingdom, whatever our views during the referendum campaign, we must now unite in a common task to build a generous and forward looking country, contributing to human flourishing around the world. We must remain hospitable and compassionate, builders of bridges and not barriers. Many of those living among us and alongside us as neighbours, friends and work colleagues come from overseas and

some will feel a deep sense of insecurity. We must respond by offering reassurance, by cherishing our wonderfully diverse society, and by affirming the unique contribution of each and every one.

The referendum campaign has been vigorous and at times has caused hurt to those on one side or the other. We must therefore act with humility and courage – being true to the principles that make the very best of our nation. Unity, hope and generosity will enable us to overcome the period of transition that will now happen, and to emerge confident and successful. The opportunities and challenges that face us as a nation and as global citizens are too significant for us to settle for less.

As those who hope and trust in the living God, let us pray for all our leaders, especially our Prime Minister. We also pray for leaders across Europe, and around the world, as they face this dramatic change. Let us pray especially that we may go forward to build a good United Kingdom that, though relating to the rest of Europe in a new way will play its part amongst the nations in the pursuit of the common good throughout the world."

Freshly prepared food is available all day, from satisfying soup to scrummy cakes-all served with a smile. The HOPE Centre is open Monday to Friday from 9:30 to 5:00, and Saturday from 9:30 to 4:00.

Managed by Christine Togneri, the Hope Centre is staffed by a team of volunteers from churches across the town and further afield. As you walk into the HOPE Centre, as well as that delicious coffee, the first thing that you notice is the atmosphere, a haven of calm, a place where the elderly are not rushed, where children are welcome, a space to come with a group of friends or alone and be offered warmth. Though no one will pressurise you if you are just browsing, if you need help in selecting a Bible or a special gift, one of the staff or volunteers will be pleased to help and if it's not in stock, many items can be ordered. People have time to listen, both volunteers and those who come into the HOPE Centre for just that purpose that are lonely or need to talk to someone; the Listening Service is an important part of the work of the HOPE Centre, again volunteers with listening skills and God's love to share and to spare.

Over the years volunteers have gone on to paid work as a result of the confidence and experience they have gained at the HOPE Centre and young people have worked towards the Duke of Edinburgh award by helping in the café. The HOPE Centre is more than just a café; it is the Church working together to share God's love.



Climate Change: Why should you care?

limate change poses a palpable threat to our security and prosperity, yet many people are unaware of the science or prefer to believe it is just froth from scientists keen to make a living.

On Thursday 29th September in the Cheshire Suite, Macclesfield Library, there will be a presentation which will explore the reality of what's happening to our planet from species loss to melting ice sheets. It will argue that everyone should care and suggest that we shouldn't be afraid of moving to a low carbon future.

The lecture presentation will be delivered by Colin Fenwick who has a BSC in geology and a Ph.D. in geochemistry. In his career, he worked with scientific equipment used by climate scientists giving him a special insight into that community.

Colin was diagnosed with Motor Neuron Disease in 2010 and finished working in 2013. Since then he has been free to research the reality of climate change and has become increasingly worried by what he has found.

All are invited and welcome, and it's free! Please do come along.
