Please can you spare any flowers and interesting seed heads I can dry for using in church when fresh flowers are difficult to find? Any foliage you might be able to share would be very welcome too!





## Important Reminders

### Could you be a First Aider?

In order to ensure that we have First Aid cover when the church is open (for services as well as "Open Church") we have a group of named people who have current First Aid training. This provides immediate help before the emergency services arrive (if they are needed).



We have arranged to run a First Aid Course at St Michaels Church on **Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> September** (full day). There are spaces for 12 candidates, and we'd like to fill them.

The training and qualification is valuable at any time – at home, at work or out and about. There will be no charge, but the expectation is that participants make themselves available when in the church building, and, in particular, for a few hours on a Treacle Market Sunday at least once per year.



at the end of our Sunday service within the next few weeks. It will be announced at the beginning of the service that we intend to carry it out on that day.



### 'Macclesfield in 50 Buildings' by Ian Tatlock

August 15th sees the publication of a new book by Ian Tatlock, called 'Macclesfield in 50 Buildings'.

The title is self-explanatory in that the book discusses the architecture and history of 50 of the town's more eminent and attractive buildings. It is split into four main sections: Churches and Chapels (including St Michael's Church); Public Buildings; Mills; and Other Buildings; and is lavishly illustrated with 120 colour photographs. The final short chapter – 'Macclesfield in Another 50 Buildings' - is simply of list of the buildings that couldn't be accommodated in the main body of the book. It retails for £15.99.

We are now looking for people (individuals or groups/families) from the church family who will take responsibility to plant up


and maintain a planter each. As yet, their positioning has not been decided (over to the Buildings and Churchyard Team!).
