

Seeing in the Dark

A reflection from Tricia

In an effort to keep my faith-life grounded in the teachings of Jesus, I constantly read and re-read the gospels. At the moment, for this Advent Season, I am reading John's Gospel which is considered to be different from the other three

gospels in that John is teaching us to think more deeply on a spiritual level: to look at life through the eyes of people who are born of the Spirit.

The beautiful words at the beginning of John's gospel become very familiar at this time of year. Jesus, the light of the world, God in human form, wisdom personified has come to open the way for us to be in relationship with the God who loves us and who breathed life into us and all living things.

The following account written by John is composed of Jesus giving clues (signs) as to His true nature. We all know the end result of this

However, in John chapter 9 we read about the man born blind who was healed by Jesus on the Sabbath. This, of course was against the strict Jewish laws and was a direct provocation by Jesus to the Pharisees challenging them to think deeper than their religious laws and practices.

Hidden messages from Jesus on a spiritual level, appear to be that some of the religious leaders were born blind and wanted to stay that way, bound by their laws and belief systems. The man who was healed stood firm in his acknowledgement of Jesus' healing power. His parents were frightened that they would be banished from the Synagogue if they spoke out for Jesus. The Pharisees themselves were afraid of something new coming into their ordered lives.

Today in our world there is much cause for fear and anxiety. This time of year, is particularly difficult for many of us. My prayer is that we will collectively look to the light of Christ.



On page 139 of this book from our Church Library Tom Wright states 'fear, resentment, shock and anxiety cripple our understanding, restrict our faith and stifle our love.' and

'When surrounded by fear and anger the only way through it is to glimpse whatever we can see of Jesus, and to follow him out of the dark and into the light.'


Silent Vigil for Gaza

Use peat-free compost

Peatlands are important in fighting climate change as they absorb and store carbon from the atmosphere. For that reason, peat is best left where it is rather than being dug up for use in compost. Check compost is labelled 'peat-free' – a government ban on peat-based

compost is due to come into force by the end of this year.


