service will also include Holy Communion


What is confirmation?

At this special service, Andre and Martin will be affirming the vows that were made on their behalf when they were baptised as babies, and making a public commitment to follow Jesus Christ. In other words they will be saying before us all that they are seeking to embody Jesus' teaching and values in the way they live their lives. Bishop Sam will lay hands on them and ask God to empower them with the Holy Spirit to help them to live this Christ-centered way of life.

For Andre, this is a significant moment in his faith journey. I still recall first meeting him when he tentatively ventured into St Michael's one Sunday morning in 2023. We rejoice with him that he has arrived at this point of wanting us all to know that he intends to live a life of committed discipleship to Christ!

For Martin, though, there's a slight difference. Indeed, some will be wondering why he's being confirmed only now, with only a few months to go until his licensing as a Reader (Sat 11th Oct). It's for the purely pragmatic reason that, although Martin has previously been confirmed, evidence of this can't be produced, and he can't be licensed without it. His confirmation will

therefore be a conditional one, so slightly different to Andre's. I know though that Martin will value the opportunity it gives him to declare his faith before us all as he prepares to serve this church as a Reader.





Whilst with us, +Sam will also be **commissioning** our ten 'OWLs' (Occasional Worship Leaders) and our newly formed Prayer Ministry Team (read about this elsewhere).

Serving God and His Kingdom is definitely NOT restricted to things in the church building such as worship and prayer, but I'm delighted we have these teams of trained and willing volunteers to serve us in these specific ways.

So let's give thanks to God for, and pray for his blessing on: +Sam; on those being confirmed / commissioned; as well as on our Church Family as a whole.



An Invitation to the Archdeacon's Visitation

At our church's Annual Meeting (held 23rd March this year), Rachel Mayers and Matt Lewis were elected as churchwardens, to serve St Michael's for another year. I am personally so grateful and indebted to them for all they do – including much that would be unseen to most of you.

However, although appointed by parishioners and *ex officio* Trustees of the Church Council, technically they are officers of the Bishop. Their responsibilities and duties include:

- Care of the church building and churchyard .
- Management of church assets (plate, ornaments, etc.) .
- Financial matters .
- Pastoral care of the parish and PCC.
- Ensuring good health and safety, safeguarding, and administration.
- Promoting unity and peace among parishioners.

Firstly, thank you that this last item doesn't demand much of them – as far as I know!

At 7.00pm on Monday 2nd June, churchwardens from our churches and elsewhere will be admitted to their posts by the Archdeacon. This is known as the **Archdeacon's Visitation**.

During this service, the archdeacon also delivers a sermon called the 'archdeacon's charge', the aim of which is to offer advice, encouragement and support to parishes in general and churchwardens in particular.

We are honoured that St Michael's has been chosen to host this special service for the deaneries of Macclesfield and Cheadle this year.

I would be delighted if a number of members from St Michael's would show their gratitude and support to our churchwardens by attending this special occasion. Thank you.

Eco-tip



Introducing Our New Prayer Ministry Team

I'm really excited to announce that we're launching a Prayer Ministry Team here at St Michael's a week on Sunday.



Over the past month or so, members of our church family have taken part in a dedicated time of training, learning how to minister to others through Spirit-led, compassionate, and confidential prayer. These people have committed themselves to walking alongside others in faith, listening with care, and praying in pairs with sensitivity and discernment.

Why Prayer Ministry?

Prayer is at the heart of who we are as a church. We're familiar with prayer in worship, and people leaving prayer requests in the Savage Chapel. Did you know these cards are regularly prayed over by the fortnightly Prayer Group on alternate Wednesdays?

Prayer Ministry will complement this by encouraging individuals to come forward for prayer themselves.

There are so many varieties of prayer within the Bible, and especially in the New Testament. Whether we are celebrating, grieving, seeking healing and wholeness, or simply needing strength for a next step, we believe that coming together in prayer invites the presence and power of God into our every situation.

This ministry is not about anyone having all the answers - it's simply about creating a safe space where people can encounter God's love, hope, and peace through prayer.

What Can You Expect?

After being commissioned by Bishop Sam on 25th May, trained members of the Prayer Ministry Team will be available in mixed -gender pairs at the end of our Church Family Worship to pray with anyone who would like support.

All prayer ministry will be offered confidentially, respectfully, and sensitively, with the focus always on Jesus. All team members are DBS checked and have completed Safeguarding Training.

How You Can Get Involved

- Come forward for prayer when it's offered – the Team is here for you.
- Encourage others to do likewise.
- Pray for the team as they begin this new ministry.

If you have any questions about Prayer Ministry, please feel free to contact me, talk to a Team member (though not when they're on duty!), or seek out Sue Olley who is heading up the Team on our behalf.


