

The HOPE CENTRE was established in May 2011, Its key purpose to 'Serve Others'. For 14 years it has provided a space where the love of God can be clearly demonstrated to meet the needs of everyone in the community. The Hope Centre is now moving to further develop its activities and moving into a challenging but exciting time in seeking to meet identified needs within our community. As a result changes will be taking place in the management structure.

CAP Job Club Manager

The Hope Centre has entered into a partnership with the Salvation Army to establish a CAP (Christians Against Poverty) Job Club Its key purpose, working closely with the DWP (Department of Works & Pensions), is to support people back into employment. Hazel has started her training and the courses are planned to commence in early September 2025.

Homeless People

Hazel has had an increasing amount of her time supporting the growing need of the homeless in our community. In addition to her role as Job Club Manager, she will seek to develop a strategy of how best to meet and support the homeless, drawing on the significant experience within the Salvation Army.

Hope Centre Manager

We are pleased to announce that the role of 'Hope Centre Manager' will be taken over by Ruth Corn, who will join us in the last week of May. Ruth will take over Hazel's existing responsibilities, and handover from Hazel to Ruth will take place during June as Hazel also takes on her new role and responsibilities

Joe Jackson will assume the responsibility of Kitchen Manager. We are also pleased to announce that Joe will be leading a course in Cooking Classes to help those in our community to develop skills in cooking to a budget. It is hoped these will start in July.

A creative stitching retreat at Foxhill, led by Karen Herrick.

1st-3rd August

Using the story of Bartimeaus alongside creative, quiet led Biblical reflections, we will explore ways in which we come to God, and how meeting with Jesus has the potential to transform lives. 


