Presents

Try making gifts yourself! From knitting a scarf to baking a batch of biscuits, there are lots of fantastic presents you can DIY.



Buy presents from shops that make their products in an ethical and sustainable ways.

Think quality not quantity. Having a family 'Secret Santa' means you don't have to buy for everyone and there's less waste.



Avoid non-recyclable wrapping paper by using brown paper and brown paper tags. Better yet, go for a reusable option like a bag or a box

Food

Plan your meals so food doesn't go to waste. Leftovers can make some of the tastiest meals!



Shop locally. Are there ingredients for your Christmas meals that you can source from local farms or shops?



Compost your vegetable waste.

Try out some veggie and vegan alternatives to cut down on meat and dairy.




Houseplant & succulents sale

Update on Cop30

Thank you to those who prayed for a successful outcome; as has often been the case the outcome was mixed but there was progress



COP30 made history by agreeing the need for a just transition, with the strongest language on human, labour and indigenous rights ever agreed.

But the COP ended without a deal on fossil fuels.

We must continue praying for a stronger deal on climate finance, and a separate agreement on fossil fuels to be negotiated in 2026.
