For churches and congregations:

With some churches open and some closed, some services online, some church members still isolated or shielding, no singing, no communion, restricted opportunities to meet and socialise .. these are difficult times for us all. Help us to support and encourage one another. We pray for all those who find these current arrangements difficult or stressful. Amen

We pray for all those finding new ways to worship; new ways to bring Christ to others; new ways to show hope in adversity. Amen

For schools, children, teachers:

As children and teachers return to the classroom under new and difficult circumstances, we pray for them and for parents as they adapt to new situations. We pray for all those starting in new schools and for young people setting off for university and facing new challenges. From our own congregation we pray for Eleanor, Aaron, Isaac and Sharon moving from primary to high school; Aidan, Connor, Eleanor and Holly moving into new post-16 education and training and Molly heading off to Nottingham university this month. Amen.

Especially we pray for our church school, Bollinbrook, for the staff, governors, children and parents as they open their doors to the full

school once more. We pray that they have enjoyed rest and relaxation over the summer. Amen

For the Season Of Creation:

The theme chosen for this year's Season of Creation is 'Jubilee', a time to renounce overconsumption and economic systems based on constant economic growth at the cost of the Earth and those who are poor.
