

Start the Week is an extension to Open Door, focusing on praying for our town, community and the wider world.

St Michael's Church is open for **Start the Week** from 7.30am every Monday morning. Prayers are said every 30 minutes until 10am and follow the Church of England's cycle of prayer.

Start the Week provides a space for people to come at the beginning of the traditional working week where they can take time to be quiet, have a listening ear or share in conversation, a drink and light breakfast if required.

The Service of Morning Prayer is an important part of **Start the Week**. The words are Bible-based and these shortened forms of Morning Prayer are adapted from the resources in Common Worship.
